STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 6, Chapter 242, of the Public Laws
of 1909, authorizing the Commissioner of Agriculture to
seize milk cans and bottles not properly sealed and cleansed.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 6, chapter 242, of the Public Laws of
2 1909 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:
3 'and may by himself or his duly authorized agent seize with-
4 out warrant such cans, bottles or other vessels used in the
5 purchase or sale of milk or cream as may, in his judgment,
6 be necessary to be used as evidence in cases of the violation
7 of the law relating to the sealing of such cans, bottles or
8 other vessels, and the law requiring that all cans, bottles or
9 other vessels shall be cleansed and sterilized before being
10 forwarded to producers or distributors of milk.'

Said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘The commissioner of agriculture shall diligently enforce,
13 or cause to be enforced, all provisions of this act and may
14 by himself or his duly authorized agent seize without war-
15 rant such cans, bottles or other vessels used in the purchase
16 or sale of milk or cream as may, in his judgment, be neces-
17 sary to be used as evidence in cases of the violation of the
18 law relating to the sealing of such cans, bottles or other
19 vessels, and the law requiring that all cans, bottles or other
20 vessels shall be cleansed and sterilized before being forward-
21 ed to producers or distributors of milk.’
