STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section sixty-two of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter forty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five relating to free high schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section sixty-two of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter forty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five is hereby repealed and in place thereof the following is substituted:

'Sect. 62. Any town which does not maintain a free high school of standard grade may, from year to year, authorize its superintending school committee to contract with and pay the superintending school committee of any ad-

9 joining town or the trustees of any academy located within
10 such town or in an adjoining town, for the tuition of schol-
11 ars within said town in the studies contemplated by the
12 seven preceding Sections. When such contract has been
13 made with the trustees of an academy a joint committee for
14 the selection of teachers and the arrangement of the course
15 of study in such academy shall include the superintending
16 school committees of the contracting towns with an equal
17 number of members of the board of trustees of such acad-
18 emy when such academy has less than ten thousand dollars
19 endowment. The expenditure of any town for tuition as
20 provided in this section shall be subject to the same condi-
21 tions and shall entitle such town to the same state aid as if it
22 had made such expenditure for a free high school.'
