STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section twenty-six, Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, to provide for school privileges for scholars living at fog warning stations and life saving stations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-six of chapter fifteen of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the
3 word "station" in the second line thereof the words 'fog
4 warning station, or life saving station,' that said section
5 when amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 26. Persons between the ages of five and twenty-
7 one years living at any light station, fog warning station or
8 life saving station shall be admitted to any public school in
9 the state without paying tuition; such scholars shall be en-

10 titled to all privileges and benefits, and be subject to the
11 same conditions, rules and regulations as scholars residing
12 in the town in which they attend school.'
