STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section four of chapter fifty-seven of the Revised Statutes relating to the organization of libraries and charitable societies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 4 of chapter 57 of the Revised Stat-2 utes is hereby amended so that said section, as amended, shall 3 read as follows:

'Sect. 4. Before commencing business the president, treas-5 urer and majority of the directors or trustees of every cor-6 poration organized under the foregoing sections shall pre-7 pare a certificate setting forth the name and purpose of the 8 corporation, the town where located, the number and names 9 of the officers, and shall sign and make oath to it; and after 10 it has been examined by the Attorney General, and been by 11 him certified to be properly drawn and signed and to be
12 conformable to the constitution and laws, it shall be recorded
13 in the registry of deeds in the county where said corporation
14 is located, in a book kept for that purpose, and within sixty
15 days after the day of the meeting at which such corporation
16 is organized, a copy thereof certified by such register shall
17 be filed in the secretary of state's office, who shall enter the
18 date of filing thereon, and on the original certificate to be
19 kept by the corporation, and shall record said copy in a book
20 kept for that purpose. No fee shall be hereunder required
21 by the attorney general or secretary of state, but registers
22 of deeds shall receive for recording such certificate the fees
23 provided by section eighteen of chapter one hundred seven24 teen of the Revised Statutes.'
