STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine School for Feeble Minded.

Whereas, the appropriation called for in this resolve is now due and immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, and in the opinion of the Legislature this fact constitutes an emergency as contemplated by the constitution, be it therefore

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of twelve thousand five hundred seventy-four dollars and
3 fifty-eight cents, balance due upon contract for work upon
4 two brick dormitory buildings at the Maine School for
5 Feeble Minded.

In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve
7 shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The amount carried in this resolve is due Messrs. Smith and Rumery of Portland, Maine, for balance due them for work upon two brick dormitory buildings at the Maine School for Feeble Minded, as certified to the State Auditor by Messrs. Coombs Bros., architects, of Lewiston, Maine, under date of January 25, 1911.
