STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend paragraph one of section forty-two of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended providing for the payments from State School Funds of amounts paid on account of union superintendence.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Paragraph one of section forty-two of chapter

- 2 fifteen of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by the ad-
- 3 dition after the word "year" in line fifteen of said section
- 4 the following: 'and provided further that the annual appro-
- 5 priation for payments under this act shall be deducted from
- 6 state school funds,' so that said section when amended shall
- 7 read as follows:

'Sect. 42. I. Whenever the chairman and secretary of said

9 joint committee shall certify under oath to the state superin-10 tendent of schools, according to form prescribed by the state 11 superintendent that a union has been maintained and a super-12 intendent employed as provided in sections forty and forty-13 one of this chapter, which certification shall be made quar-14 terly, on the first days of January, April, July and October 15 of each year, then, upon approval of said certificate by the 16 state superintendent of schools, payment shall be made out 17 of the sum appropriated for superintendence of towns com-18 prising school unions and out of any moneys in the treasury 19 not otherwise appropriated to the superintendent so em-20 ployed of a sum equal to twice the aggregate sum paid by 21 the towns comprising the union, provided that the amount so 22 paid for the benefit of a single union of towns shall not ex-23 ceed eight hundred dollars in one year, and provided fur-24 ther that the annual appropriation for payments under this 25 act shall be deducted from state school funds.
