STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, to amend Section eight of Article nine of the Constitution of the State of Maine.

Resolved: Two-thirds of both branches of the Legislature
2 concurring, that the following amendment of the Constitu-
3 tion of the State of Maine be proposed for the action of the
4 legal voters of this state at the next gubernatorial election
5 in manner provided by the Constitution.

Section eight of article nine is amended by adding after
7 the word "estate" in the first line, the words 'located within
8 any city, town or organized plantation' and by adding to said
9 section the following words: 'but the Legislature may au-
10 thorize a special tax to be assessed upon the wild lands of
11 the state and upon all property not located within the limits
12 of an organized city, town or plantation, said tax not to
13 exceed one per cent of the valuation of said wild land or

14 other property, in any one year,' so that said section as
15 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 8. All taxes assessed upon real and personal estate,
17 located within any city, town or organized plantation as-
18 sessed by authority of this state, shall be apportioned and
19 assessed equally according to the just value thereof, but the
20 Legislature may authorize a special tax to be assessed upon
21 the wild lands of the state, and upon all property not located
22 within the limits of an organized city, town, or plantation,
23 said tax not to exceed one per cent of the valuation of said
24 wild land or other property in any one year.
