STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to appropriate moneys for the expenditures of gov-
ernment for the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

Whereas, the appropriation of moneys for the maintenance
of the several branches of the state government and its institu-
tions is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the
preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now there-
fore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. In order to provide for the several acts and
2 resolves of the Legislature requiring the payment of money
3 from the state treasury, and also to provide in part for the
4 necessary expenditures of government, for the current
5 fiscal year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the fol-

6 lowing sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in
 7 the state treasury, and, except where otherwise specially
 8 provided, the governor with the advice and consent of the
 9 council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first
 10 day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, to draw
 11 his warrant on the state treasurer for the same.
