STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Phillips.

Resolved: That the sum of two hundred fifty-five dollars 2 and eighty-six cents be, and hereby is, appropriated to be 3 paid to the town of Phillips for the purpose of reimbursing 4 said town for money paid out on account of George A. 5 Stewart, a State pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

During the period of time covered in the itemized bill annexed George A. Stewart was residing in the town of Phillips. In the latter part of the year 1906 he fell into distress, and the town of Phillips expended for his support and maintenance from Dec. 31st, 1906, to Feb. 27th, 1909, inclusive, the sum of two hundred fifty-five dollars and eighty-six cents. The said George A. Stewart did not have any pauper settlement in the town of Phillips or in any other town in the State; evidence to that effect was sent in to the proper State officials by the municipal officers, but up to this time the town has never been reimbursed for the amount expended.
