IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to regulate the use of Songo Lock by steamboats,  
vessels, or other boats.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person in charge  
2 of any steamboat, vessel, or other boats, not engaged in  
3 making regular daily trips, through Songo Lock, carrying  
4 United States mail or through passengers, after being noti-  
5 fied by the tender of Songo Lock, to enter Songo Lock with  
6 any steamboat, vessel, or other boats, at times when by so  
7 entering said lock the regular mail or passenger boats will  
8 be unreasonably delayed.

Provided, however, that this act shall not apply to steam-  
10 boats, vessels or other boats, conveying officers of the law  
11 or physicians on official or professional duty.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall  
2 forfeit to the state twenty-five dollars and costs for each  
3 offense.
