STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to regulate the use of Songo Lock by steamboats, vessels, or other boats.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. It shall be unlawful for any person in charge
of any steamboat, vessel, or other boats, not engaged in
making regular daily trips, through Songo Lock, carrying
United States mail or through passengers, after being notified by the tender of Songo Lock, to enter Songo Lock with
any steamboat, vessel, or other boats, at times when by so
entering said lock the regular mail or passenger boats will
be unreasonably delayed.

Provided, however, that this act shall not apply to steam-10 boats, vessels or other boats, conveying officers of the law 11 or physicians on official or professional duty.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 forfeit to the state twenty-five dollars and costs for each 3 offense.
