STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT relating to the use of Automobiles in the Town of
Mount Desert, Hancock Co., State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. So much of chapter one hundred and thirty-
2 three of the Private and Special Laws of the State of
3 Maine for the year nineteen hundred and nine as relates to
4 the town of Mount Desert, Hancock county, Maine, is here-
5 by repealed.

Sect. 2. Section one of chapter twenty-three of the Pri-
2 vate and Special Laws of the State of Maine for the year
3 nineteen hundred and seven is hereby amended by striking
4 out all of said section after the word "automobiles" in the
5 third line thereof, and inserting in the place thereof the

6 following words: 'On any or all of the highways or town-
7 ways in said town which said by-law may declare to be for
8 any reason dangerous or unsuitable for their use. Any
9 section of road so closed shall be marked at the entrance
10 thereof by sign-boards in large letters, "no automobiles al-
11 lowed on this road."' so that said section as amended shall
12 read as follows:

• 'Section 1. The town of Mount Desert in the county of
14 Hancock at any legal meeting of the voters thereof, may
15 adopt by-laws prohibiting the use of automobiles on any
16 or all of the highways or townways in said town which said
17 by-law may declare to be for any reason dangerous or un-
18 suitable for their use. Any section of road so closed shall
19 be marked at the entrance thereof by sign-boards in large
20 letters, "No automobiles allowed on this road."'

Sect. 3. This act shall not apply and shall not authorize
2 said town to prohibit the use of automobiles upon any part
3 of the highway referred to and described in section two of
4 chapter two hundred and seventy-two of the private and
5 special laws of the State of Maine for the year nineteen
6 hundred and eleven.

Sect. 4. Subject to the provisions of the state constitu-
2 tion hereto applicable, this act shall take effect ten days
3 after it shall be accepted by said town of Mount Desert at
4 any legal meeting called by a warrant containing an article
5 for the purpose.
