STATE OF MAINE

---

RESOLVE in favor of aid in building a Highway Bridge  
across Moose river, in Jackman plantation in the county of  
Somerset.

---

*Resolved*, That the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4000)  
2 be, and hereby is, appropriated to aid in building a highway  
3 bridge across Moose river in the plantation of Jackman, in  
4 the county of Somerset, subject to the following provisions:  
That the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2000) shall be  
6 raised by the county of Somerset and two thousand dollars  
7 (\$2000) shall be raised by the plantations of Jackman, Den-  
8 nistown and Moose River, in said county of Somerset; said  
9 two thousand dollars (\$2000) to be raised in the plan-  
10 tations of Jackman, Dennistown and Moose River to be ap-  
11 portioned among said plantations according to their respec-  
12 tive valuations. And said county of Somerset and said

13 plantations of Jackman, Dennistown and Moose River are  
14 hereby authorized and required to raise the sums herein  
15 provided, for them to raise, by loan, taxation, or otherwise.

Provided, also, that abutments of said bridge shall be con-  
17 structed of concrete; and the superstructure of steel, which  
18 shall be eighteen feet wide, exclusive of a sidewalk which  
19 shall be placed upon one side only of said bridge.

Provided, also, that the location and erection of said bridge  
21 shall be made by the county commissioners of Somerset  
22 county under the supervision of the State Highway Depart-  
23 ment.
