STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT giving pensions to the widows of the Soldiers of the
Aroostook War.

Re it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 145, Sect. 4 of the Revised Statutes
2 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

‘Any citizen of Maine who served in the drafted quota of
4 the militia in the Aroostook war, and has been honorably
5 discharged and has been unable from his own resources to
6 obtain a livelihood for himself and those dependent upon
7 him, shall be entitled to a pension from the state of eight

8 dollars per month. The same shall be paid in accordance
9 with the regulations provided in the following sections.

‘And the sum of eight dollars per month shall be paid to
11 the widow of any such soldier. The same shall be paid in
12 accordance with the regulations provided in the following
13 sections.’
