STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine Pomological Society.

Whereas, the question of better fruit for the State of Maine is of the greatest importance to our State welfare, now, therefore, be it,

Resolved That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of two thousand dollars annually, to be paid to the 3 Maine State Pomological Society, this amount to be used 4 by the society for the purpose of promoting the interests of 5 better fruit growing in Maine by holding an annual exhibition wherein premiums on horticultural products shall be 7 paid, and such field meetings as may be thought profitable 8 by the executive committee, and for the payment of any 9 other incidental expenses thereof, including salaries of not 10 over two hundred dollars; provided an itemized account of

11 all moneys expended be rendered each year to the Com-12 missioner of Agriculture, and upon his approval and pres-13 entation of proper vouchers, said appropriation shall be paid.
