STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section seven, Chapter one hundred twenty-eight of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter one hundred, of the Public Laws of one thousand nine hundred and five, relating to malicious mischief.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section seven of Chapter one hundred twenty-eight of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter one hundred of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five is hereby further amended by inserting after the word "Railroad" the words 'Highway or other engineering', so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 7. Whoever wilfully or maliciously disturbs, removes or destroys any transit point, reference point, stake,

9 plug, hub, guard-stake, bench mark, or other monument of
10 any railroad, highway or other engineering location or sur-
11 vey, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five
12 dollars, or imprisonment not exceeding thirty days; and in
13 addition shall be liable in an action of debt for the amount
14 of damage done.'
