RESOLVE, in favor of Philinda A. Brown of Topsfield.

Resolved: That a pension of ten dollars per month be al-2 lowed Philinda A. Brown, of Topsfield, Maine, Washington 3 county, deserted widow of Moses E. Brown of Co. H, of 4 the 15th Regiment of Infantry, beginning with the first day 5 of January, nineteen hundred and thirteen, and continuing 6 during the pleasure of the legislature and until otherwise

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Philinda A. Brown of Topsfield, Maine, the deserted wife of the said Moses E. Brown of Co. H. of the 15th Regiment of Inf., is now receiving a United States pension of \$12 per month.

At the advanced age of 79 years, and wholly destitute of any property, whatever, blind in both eyes, she is unable to contribute to her support in any way. She is obliged to pay for her support and care, and her present pension is too small for her support. She is a woman of good habits and we hope and pray for her relief.
