STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to provide for licensing engineers of stationary engines.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall have charge of or operate any
2 stationary steam boiler or engine in this state, except boilers
3 in private residences or apartment houses, boilers under the
4 jurisdiction of the United States, boilers used for agricul5 tural purposes exclusively, and boilers used for heating pur6 poses exclusively, unless he holds a license, as hereinafter
7 provided. The owner or user of a stationary steam boiler
8 or engine, other than the boilers or engines above excepted,
9 shall not operate or cause to be operated a steam boiler or

10 engine for a period of more than one week, unless the per-11 son in charge of and operating it is duly licensed.

- Sect. 2. Whoever desires to act as engineer of a station-2 ary engine shall apply for a license therefor to the Secretary 3 of State, upon blanks to be furnished for that purpose. The 4 application shall be accompanied by a fee of two dollars, and 5 shall show the total experience of said applicant.
- Sect. 3. The application shall contain a series of questions 2 tending to ascertain the experience and qualifications of the 3 applicant. The application shall be signed by the applicant 4 and sworn to before a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, 5 or other officer duly authorized to administer oaths in this 6 state.
- Sect. 4. The application must show that the applicant is 2 at least twenty-one years of age; that he has served at least 3 two years as a fireman of stationary engines; that he is of 4 good moral character and of sober habits, a citizen or naturalized citizen of the United States.
- Sect. 5. If it appears to the Secretary of State that all 2 the questions in said application for license have been proper-3 ly answered, and that the applicant has had the required 4 two years experience as a fireman, and the application in all 5 other respects in compliance with the law, he shall issue a 6 license to the applicant, which will permit the applicant to 7 operate a stationary engine in any place in this state. A li-8 cense shall continue in force for two years from date of its 9 issue, unless it shall be sooner revoked for incompetence

10 or untrustworthiness of the licensee, and when revoked, it 11 shall continue revoked until a new application shall be made 12 and a new license issued.

- Sect. 6. A license may be renewed at the end of the term 2 thereof without payment of any fee for such renewal, if ap-3 plication shall be made for such renewal within six months 4 from the date of expiration of the license.
- Sect. 7. A license granted under the preceding section 2 shall be placed so as to be easily read in a conspicuous place 3 on or about the engine being operated by the said licensee.
- Sect. 8. Any wilfully false answer made by the applicant 2 for a license as above provided in the application for said 3 license shall be and is hereby declared to be perjury and 4 shall be punished accordingly.
- Sect. 9. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of 2 this act shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hun-3 dred dollars and not more than five hundred dollars, or by 4 imprisonment for not less than thirty days nor more than 5 three months, or both. Trial Justices, Municipal Courts 6 and Police Courts shall have jurisdiction of offenses under 7 this act.
