STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of a road in Elliottsville Plantation.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of two hundred dollars to aid in the repair of the road 3 leading from Wilson Bridge in the plantation of Elliotts-4 ville, in Piscataquis county, to the Bodfish Valley Farm, so-5 called, near the head of Lake Onawa; the same to be ex-6 pended under the direction of the State Highway Department.



STATEMENT OF FACT.

The road named in the resolve is the chief thoroughfare to the head of Lake Onawa where is located a large summer colony that means much to the surrounding farmers. It is also a road that is used by the farmers in the winter lumbering operations. Elliottsville has a voting population of thirty-five, a valuation of \$142,425, and is heavily taxed for roads and bridge. The sum asked for is urgently needed and will greatly aid in the development of the plantation.
