STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to authorize the Appointment of Portland High
School Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The city council of the city of Portland is
2 hereby authorized to appoint a commission consisting of
3 three citizens of Portland, of whom the present mayor shall
4 be one, to whose supervision and execution shall be com-
5 mitted the designs, details, requirements and erection of
6 either a new high school building, or an addition to the
7 present high school building, as the city council shall order

8 and direct. Each member of said commission shall serve
9 without pay, and the two members, other than the mayor,
10 shall be elected by the city council upon nomination by the
11 mayor to serve until said new building or addition shall be
12 completed; and any vacancies arising from resignation or
13 otherwise shall be filled in same manner. Any succeeding
14 mayor shall also be ex-officio a member of said commis-
15 sion.

Said commission may call and receive bids and proposals
17 for erecting said building, and in the name and on behalf
18 of the city execute such contracts therefor, as the city coun-
19 cil shall authorize, and shall see that the same are faithfully
20 and promptly performed. Money appropriated by said city
21 council for erecting said building shall be paid out only on
22 the written approval of said commission, or a majority
23 thereof; and a report of its work and expenditures shall be
24 made at such times as the city council may require.
