STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT relating to Fort Kent Water Company, extending its charter, and ratifying and confirming its organization and proceedings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All the rights, powers, and privileges of the
2 Fort Kent Water Company, referred to in chapter one hun-
3 dred and seventy-one of the private and special laws of
4 nineteen hundred and five, are hereby extended to January
5 first, nineteen hundred and fourteen, and said corporation
6 is hereby given until said first day of January for the con-
7 struction of its works as so authorized.

Sect. 2. The organization of the said Fort Kent Water
2 Company, under chapter one hundred and seventy-one of the

3 private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five is
4 hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Sect. 3. The existing contract between said Fort Kent
2 Water Company and the Fort Kent Village Corporation,
3 dated the eleventh day of September, A. D. 1912, and the
4 contract between said water company and Moore & Com-
5 pany, for the construction of its works, are hereby ratified,
6 confirmed, and made valid.

Sect. 4. The mortgage deed of trust from the Fort Kent
2 Water Company aforesaid to the Liberty Trust Company of
3 Boston, Massachusetts, as trustee, dated January first, one
4 thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the issue of bonds
5 thereby secured, are hereby ratified, confirmed, and made
6 valid.
