STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter four hundred and twenty-nine of
the Private and Special Laws of one thousand nine hundred
and one, entitled "An Act to establish a Municipal Court in
the town of Winthrop."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twelve of Chapter four hundred and
2 twenty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of one thou-
3 sand nine hundred and one is hereby repealed and the fol-
4 lowing section enacted in lieu thereof:

'Sect. 12. The salary of said judge shall be four hundred
6 dollars and such fees as are allowed by the general law, and
7 the same shall be payable quarterly out of the treasury of
8 the county of Kennebec on the first days of January, April,
9 July and October. All fines and costs received in criminal
10 cases shall be paid quarterly into the County Treasury; and

11 no salary shall be paid to said judge until he shall file with
12 the County Treasurer a written statement of the fines and
13 criminal costs by him received during and for the preceding
14 quarter.

The recorder of said court shall receive an annual salary
16 of one hundred dollars in full for all his services, payable
17 quarterly on the first days of January, April, July and Oc-
18 tober.'

Sect. 2. Section thirteen of said Chapter four hundred
2 and twenty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of one
3 thousand nine hundred and one is hereby amended so as to
4 read as follows:

'Sect. 13. The judge shall receive all fines, forfeitures
6 and costs paid into court in criminal proceedings, but shall
7 pay over all other fees to the persons to whom they were
8 allowed when called for, if called for within one year.

All fines and forfeitures received by him and all fees so
10 received but not seasonably called for, he shall account for
11 and pay over at the time and manner required by law.'

Sect. 3. Section sixteen of said Chapter four hundred and
2 twenty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of one thou-
3 sand nine hundred and one is hereby amended so as to read
4 as follows:

'Sect. 16. All existing acts, public or private, inconsistent
6 with Section two of the original act, are repealed so far as
7 the same relate to jurisdiction over any matter, person or
8 thing in the towns mentioned in Section one hereof.'
