STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT granting to the Knox County Power Company the right to generate and sell electricity in the municipalities of Thomaston and Rockland, together with pole rights therein.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Knox County Power Company, a corpo-2 ration organized under the general law, its successors and 3 assigns are hereby authorized and empowered to make, gen-4 erate, manufacture, sell and distribute electricity for heat, 5 light, mechanical and power purposes in the municipalities 6 of Thomaston and Rockland, in the County of Knox, State

Sect. 2. The Knox County Power Company, its success-2 ors and assigns are hereby authorized and empowered to

- 3 erect poles in and through the streets and highways of the 4 municipalities of Thomaston and Rockland, in the County 5 of Knox, State of Maine, for the purpose of running wires 6 thereon, and to construct and maintain lines, poles, wires 7 and fixtures for the transmission of electricity for heat, light, 8 power and mechanical purposes.
- Sect. 3. Before the franchise hereby granted can be exer-2 cised permission of the municipalities must be obtained in 3 accordance with the statute in such case made and provided, 4 relative to the location of poles and wires.
- Sect. 4. The Knox County Power Company, its success2 ors and assigns are hereby authorized to purchase from any
 3 corporation or individual authorized to sell electrical power,
 4 franchise rights, and all personal and real property neces5 sary for its corporate purposes.
