## STATE OF MAINE

---

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

---

AN ACT establishing a close time on Lobsters in the waters  
of Jonesport and Addison, in Washington county.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. No person shall take, catch or kill or destroy  
2 any lobsters between the first day of July and the first day  
3 of September in each year in any of the waters of Jones-  
4 port and Addison in Washington county, within the follow-  
5 ing points: Commencing at the spindle in Pleasant river  
6 and running southwest by south, three and three-fourth  
7 miles, abreast the buoy on Barton's Ledge, thence south  
8 by west one fourth west, five and one-third miles, thence

9 east, southeast, eight and one-fourth miles, thence east  
10 three-fourths north to the whistling buoy off Moose-Peak,  
11 thence northeast, seven and three-fourths miles, to a point  
12 half the distance from Scabby Island ledge to the Brothers,  
13 thence north by west three-fourths west, one and one-half  
14 miles, thence northwest, two and two-thirds miles, thence  
15 northwest by west two miles, thence north by east, three-  
16 fourths miles, thence west by north one-half north to the  
17 head of Mason's Bay; and no person shall set a trap within  
18 said waters for the purpose of taking, catching, killing or  
19 destroying any lobsters between said dates, under a penalty  
20 of one dollar (\$1.00) for each lobster so taken, caught,  
21 killed or destroyed, and under a penalty of five dollars  
22 (\$5.00) for each lobster trap so set for said purpose.

Sect. 2. All fines and penalties provided for by this act  
2 may be recovered as provided by section forty-eight of  
3 chapter two hundred and eighty-five of the Public Laws  
4 of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven.
