STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to incorporate the Perry Telephone Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Ernest M. Scott, William Bayless, Justin E.

- 2 Gove, James A. McFaul and their associates, successors and
- 3 assigns are hereby created a corporation by the name of
- 4 the Perry Telephone Company, with all the powers, rights
- 5 and privileges, and subject to all the duties and obligations
- 6 of similar corporations under the general laws of this state.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to con-

2 struct, own, maintain and operate telephone line or lines

- 3 any where in and throughout the town of Perry in the 4 county of Washington and state of Maine, and within the 5 limits aforesaid, to locate, construct and maintain its lines 6 upon and along any public way, railroad, bridge, or private 7 lands, but in such manner as not to discommode or endan-8 ger the customary public use thereof, and with power to 9 establish and collect tolls on said lines.
- Sect. 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized and em2 powered to connect its line or lines with those of any other
 3 telephone company, or corporation on such terms as may
 4 be agreed upon, or to sell or lease its line or lines of tele5 phone and property in whole or part, either before or after
 6 completion, to any other telephone company or corporation
 7 as provided by law, or upon such terms as may be agreed
 8 by the contracting parties, which sale or lease shall be
 9 binding upon the parties; or may purchase or lease any
 10 other line or lines of telephone upon such terms and con11 ditions as may be agreed by the parties thereto.
- Sect. 4. If the land or any individual or corporation is 2 taken under this act, and the parties cannot agree on the 3 damages occasioned thereby, they shall be estimated, 4 secured and paid in the manner provided in case of land 5 taken for highways.
- Sect. 5. The capital stock of said corporation shall be of 2 such amount as said corporation may, from time to time 3 determine to be necessary, but not exceeding the sum of 4 ten thousand dollars, for the sole purpose of owning, leas-

5 ing, constructing, maintaining and operating the line or 6 lines of telephone hereby authorized and contemplated, and 7 the said corporation may purchase, hold, lease, sell and 8 convey all real estate and personal property necessary for 9 the purposes contemplated in this charter.

Sect. 6. The first incorporator named in this act may call 2 the first meeting of the corporation by mailing a written 3 notice signed by himself, postage paid, to each of the other 4 corporators, seven days at least before the day of said 5 meeting, naming the time, place and purposes of such meeting, and at such meeting a president, secretary, treasurer 7 and directors may be chosen, by-laws adopted, present 8 amount of capital stock fixed, and any corporate business 9 transacted.
