IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN. .

AN ACT relating to the town of Caribou.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The inhabitants of the town of Caribou, a mu
nicipal corporation, in the County of Aroostook and State

Maine, are hereby authorized and empowered to accept

the legacy bequeathed and devised to them, in their corpo
rate capacity, by Jefferson Cary, late of Caribou, in said

County, by his last will and testament, duly admitted to pro
bate in said County, by the Probate Court having jurisdic
tion thereof, on the fifteenth day of October, A. D. 1912,

for the founding and endowing of a secular and non-secta
rian general hospital, for the treatment of medical and surgi-

11 cal diseases, for the use and benefit of all kinds and grades
12 of suffering humanity.

Sect. 2. Said inhabitants of said town of Caribou or their 2 successors, at any annual town meeting or at any special 3 town meeting called for that purpose, within the time limited 4 for the acceptance of said legacy, in the last will and testament of the said Jefferson Cary, may by a majority vote of 6 the legal voters present and voting at any such meeting, vote 7 to accept and receive the same. After the inhabitants of said 8 town of Caribou or their successors have voted at a legal 9 town meeting as aforesaid, to accept said legacy given with 10 the object and for the purposes aforesaid, they shall have 11 power forever to hold the same, and all property and pro- 12 ceeds thereof, and accumulate and manage the same upon 13 the trusts and according to the conditions provided in the 14 aforesaid will and testament of the said Jefferson Cary.
