STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Danforth.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of three hundred and ninety-three dollars and 87 cents
3 in favor of the town of Danforth for reimbursement for
4 State pauper supplies furnished to Patrick Kinney from
5 March 26, 1907, to July 1, 1909.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The overseers of the Poor of the town of Danforth were unaware of Chapter 142 of the Public Laws of 1905 known as the Alien Law would apply to this particular case until Attorney General Philbrook rendered an opinion in 1909 which was later confirmed by the Law Court Decision in the case City of Augusta vs. City of Waterville therefor they did not render to the State proofs and account at the time required by law.

The proper State officials have approved the bills of the support of said Patrick Kinney since July 1, 1909.

All the papers and proofs required by State in regard to this case are on file at the State House in Augusta.

Patrick Kinney died June 23, 1911. The State has paid all of his expenses from July 1, 1909 to the time of his death and his burial expenses.
