STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the City of Biddeford.

Resolved: That the sum of five hundred and ninety-one 2 dollars and eighty-two cents be, and the same is hereby ap-3 propriated to be paid by the Treasurer of State to the city 4 of Biddeford out of moneys of the State, not otherwise ap-5 propriated, for money expended by the city of Biddeford 6 for the care and support of Joseph Taillon, a State insane 7 pauper, and said sum shall be paid only on vouchers, pro-8 duced by said city of Biddeford and approved by the Gov-9 ernor and Council. ,

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Joseph Taillon was committed to the insane asylum, May 31, 1904, and for his support and care the city of Biddeford paid the State \$883.17 down to Oct. 8, 1909. Of this sum \$132.93 has been repaid to the city of Biddeford by the State, so that the present claim of the city against the State is \$750.24. Taillon never had residence at any time in the State of Maine. The city of Biddeford paid all the bills for his care and support except as above stated. Affidavits are on file in the State Auditor's office.
