**RESOLVE**, in favor of Stockholm Plantation.

Resolved: That the sum of forty-five dollars be appropri-2 ated to Stockholm Plantation in the County of Aroostook, 3 to reimburse said Stockholm Plantation for the burial of a 4 stranger, found dead in a freight car on the 23rd day of

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

We the undersigned assessors of Stockholm Plantation on oath depose and say, that on the 23rd day of September, 1910, a stranger best known as a tramp, was found dead in a freight car in said Stockholm Plantation, and turned over to the assessors of said Stockholm for burial.

The said assessors notified the County Attorney of the circumstances and requested a coroner, that the said County Attorney sent a State Medical Examiner, to wit S. W. Boone, M. D., of Presque Isle, of said county, and the said assessors believing him to be a coroner, buried the stranger, and the expenses of the said burial were as follows:

C. M. Morgan for casket and services, thirty dollars, (\$30.00) Louis Anderson services, fifteen dollars, (\$15.00)

That the said assessors made up a claim and sent it to the Governor's Council to be reimbursed under Chapter 185, Public Laws of 1909, the Council claimed as there was no coroner to make a certificate, that they could not safely reimburse said Stockholm Plantation.

Hence it is necessary for a resolve, to carry out the spirit of said Public Laws.

The receipted bills are in the office of the Governor's Council.
