STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN

AN ACT relating to the protection of Smelts in the Sasanoa River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No smelts shall be taken or fished for in tidal 2 waters of the Sasanoa River, except by hook and line, start-3 ing at the western point of Sasanoa Bluff on the west, and 4 continuing easterly to the eastern point of Hell Gates on the 5 east, under penalty of not less than ten nor more than fifty 6 dollars for each offence.

Sect. 2. Any person convicted of fishing or catching 2 smelts within mean high water mark starting at Sasanoa 3 Bluffs on the north bank of the Sasanoa River continuing

4 easterly to the east bank of Hell Gates shore in the Sasanoa5 River in any other way than hook and line shall be punished6 by a fine of not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars by7 complaint or indictment, one-half to the use of the complain-8 ant and one-half to the county.

Full jurisdiction to impose said fine is hereby conferred 10 upon the municipal court in Sagadahoc county.

Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this 2 act are hereby repealed.
