IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to regulate the use of Hat-pins, and Other Decorative  
Utilities.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Whoever shall, on and after the first day of  
2 January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hun-  
3 dred and fourteen, wear in or upon his person, or in or  
4 upon any article of apparel, any hat-pin, hair-pin, charm, or  
5 other decorative device or utility, so exposed that it may  
6 endanger the life, sight, hearing, or other physical functions,  
7 or otherwise interfere with the domestic tranquility of any  
8 human being, shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanor  
9 and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars,

10 to be recovered on complaint; half for the state, and half  
11 for the complainant.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and  
2 police courts and trial justices, within their respective coun-  
3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent  
4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts.
