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STATE OF MAINE

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RESOLVE in favor of the town of Castine.

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*Resolved,* That the sum of three hundred and sixty-three  
2 dollars and sixty-five cents be and hereby is appropriated  
3 to reimburse the town of Castine in the county of Hancock,  
4 State of Maine, for money expended in nineteen hundred  
5 and five, nineteen hundred and six, nineteen hundred and  
6 seven, nineteen hundred and eight, in furnishing pauper  
7 supplies, board and lodging to Terence O'Reilly.



## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This claim is made under the provisions of chapter 142, of the Public Laws of 1905, known as the Alien Law. Terence O'Reilly was an alien. Beginning with the year 1909, claims for the support of this pauper have been allowed in the usual manner.

Claims prior to the year 1909 were not filed with the Governor and Council within the time provided by chapter 113 of the Public Laws of 1907. Hence a special resolve is necessary to reimburse the town of Castine.

The original draft as presented called for reimbursement for the years 1897, 1898, 1899, 1900, 1901, 1902, 1903, 1904, 1905, 1906, 1907, 1908, but as no claims are allowed prior to March 23rd, 1905, the present draft called for reimbursement for the years 1905, 1906, 1907, 1908.
