STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the State School for Boys at South Portland for permanent improvements and insurance.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated in
2 favor of the State School for Boys at South Portland the
3 sum of three thousand, five hundred dollars for the year
4 nineteen hundred thirteen, and the sum of one thousand,
5 five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred four-
6 teen, such sums to be expended under the direction of the
7 trustees of juvenile institutions for painting, extending sewer
8 and insurance.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The appropriation requested in this resolve is for the purpose of making such general repairs as are necessary to prevent the deterioration of the property for continuance of insurance, for a necessary extension of a sewer and for the purchase of land and the construction thereon of a building to be used for the proper treatment of boys returned from parole and requiring a different method of employment and discipline from those used in other cottages. This appropriation includes an amount to be paid to an officer whose business it shall be to make proper investigations of homes in which boys are placed while on parole and for the proper investigation of the progress and condition of these boys when they are outside the care of the institution.
