RESOLVE, in favor of E. J. C. Owen.

---

*Resolved,* That there be paid to E. J. C. Owen of Buxton  
2 two dollars per month in addition to three dollars per month  
3 which he now receives, payable quarterly from the State  
4 Pension fund for soldiers, to begin April 1, 1913, and con-  
5 tinuing during the pleasure of the Legislature, and until  
6 otherwise ordered.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

E. J. C. Owen of Buxton enlisted and went to the Civil War in Company C, 27th Me. Infantry. Mr. Owen is 73 years old, receives from U. S. Government an invalid's pension of fifteen dollars per month and he receives three dollars per month State aid. He is physically unable to earn a dollar and has been so for ten years. He has no property. He has a wife who has a little property, the income of which is not ten dollars a year. Mr. Owen has a daughter who is married, has two children and is situated so she could not give much aid if necessity occasioned it.
