STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Maria A. Sylvester of Augusta.

Resolved: That there be paid to Maria A. Sylvester, sis-2 ter of Dummer Sylvester, late of Aetna, in the county of Pe-3 nobscot and State of Maine, the sum of ten dollars per 4 month, payable quarterly, from the fund appropriated for 5 military pensions, and to begin January first, nineteen hun-6 dred thirteen, in lieu of state aid now received of four dol-7 lars per month.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Maria A. Sylvester is now seventy-one years of age, in feeble health and is entirely dependent upon the state aid she receives of four dollars per month and the charity of a brother-in-law, for support. The brother-in-law is unable to work and dependent upon his United States pension. His wife has a bad heart trouble, having been unable to lie down for five years.

Maria A. Sylvester was house-keeper and lived with the late Dummer Sylvester, who was her only means of support, at the time he enlisted.

Dummer Sylvester was a member of Company K, 11th Maine Volunteers and died at Yorktown in 1862.
