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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

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AN ACT to amend section forty of chapter twenty-nine of the  
Revised Statutes relating to the sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

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*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section forty of chapter twenty-nine of the Re-  
vised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out after the  
word "beer" in the fourth line thereof, the words "and all  
other malt liquors", so that said section as amended shall  
read as follows:

'Sect. 40. No person shall at any time, by himself, his  
clerk, servant or agent, directly or indirectly, sell any intoxi-  
cating liquors of whatever origin, except as hereinbefore  
provided; wine, ale, porter, strong beer, lager beer, and

10 cider when kept or deposited with intent to sell the same  
11 for tippling purposes, or as a beverage, as well as all dis-  
12 tilled spirits, are declared intoxicating within the meaning  
13 of this chapter; but this enumeration shall not prevent any  
14 other pure or mixed liquors from being considered intoxi-  
15 cating.
