STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT prohibiting the shipment of lobsters out of the State,
during certain months.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. No person, firm, association or corporation
2 shall carry, transport or ship out of the state, by any form
3 of conveyance, or shall sell, give away, offer or expose for
4 sale with intent that the same shall be carried, transported
5 or shipped out of the state, or in any manner, directly or
6 indirectly, cause to be carried, transported or shipped as
7 aforesaid, any lobsters, from the fifteenth day of June to
8 the first day of September, in each year, under a penalty of
9 one dollar for each lobster so carried, transported, shipped,
10 or so sold, given away, offered or exposed for sale, as afore-
11 said.

Sect. 2. Any person or corporation engaged in the business of a common carrier of merchandise, who shall knowingly carry, transport or convey lobsters out of the state, or who shall carry or transport lobsters within the state, knowing that the same are to be carried, transported or shipped out of the state, from the fifteenth day of June to the first day of September, in each year, shall be liable to a penalty of fifty dollars upon each conviction thereof.

Sect. 3. All existing provisions of law relating to the marking of barrels, boxes or other packages of lobsters in transit; and the seizure, appraisal, liberation or condemnation of the same by officers, shall apply to lobsters shipped, or intended to be shipped in violation of this act.

Sect. 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.
