STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT for the better protection of alewives in Patten's Bay in the town of Surry, Hancock County, Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take,

- 2 catch, kill or destroy any alewives in the waters of Patten's
- 3 Bay in the town of Surry, Hancock County, Maine, west-
- 4 erly of a line running from the southern extremity of Wey-
- 5 mouth Point to Brown's Point, so called, on the eastern
- 6 side of Newbury Neck, including the whole of that portion
- 7 of Patten's Bay, with the exception of Patten's Pond stream.
 - Sect. 2. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to
- 2 amend or repeal any part of Chapter 305 of the Private and
- 3 Special Laws of the State of Maine of 1909.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be liable to a fine of not less than ten dollars for 3 each offense, and one dollar for each alewive so taken, to 4 be recovered by a complaint.
