STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in aid of repairing highways in the town of Trescott.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) in the year 3 1913, and two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) in the year 4 1914 for the purpose of repairing the highway in the town 5 of Trescott; both sums to be expended under the super-

6 vision of the State Highway Department.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Trescott is a small town of only \$62,000 valuation. It has no manufacturing establishments, no lumbering industries of any kind and is a very poor farming district. Trescott has four large bridges and many small ones to build and keep in repair; one of the large bridges will have to be rebuilt this coming season. In addition to the bridges she has to build and keep in repair, she has 44 miles of road to keep in repair with less than \$500. The town is also quite heavily in debt.
