STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Rosa Prentiss of Lewiston.

Resolved: That there be paid to Rosa Prentiss, widow of
2 Leander Prentiss of Lewiston, the sum of six dollars per
3 month, payable quarterly, from the fund appropriated for
4 military pensions, and to begin April 1st, nineteen hundred
5 and thirteen.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Rosa Prentiss is the widow of Leander Prentiss, a soldier in the War of the Rebellion—is 67 years of age. Mr. Prentiss died a few years ago and left no property. There are no children—no one liable for the support of Mrs. Rosa Prentiss. She lets rooms and receives a United States pension of \$12.00 per month and \$2.00 per month State aid. She has no property—is not able to go out to work. The amounts that she receives by way of pensions are insufficient to support her, taking into account what she receives by way of room rent.
