STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Bridget Kelley of Auburn.

Resolved, That there be paid to the said Bridget Kelley
2 of Auburn, widow of Edward Kelley, a soldier in the war
3 of the rebellion, the sum of ten dollars per month payable
4 quarterly from the fund appropriated for military pensions
5 and to begin April 1, 1913.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Bridget Kelley is 83 years old and is the widow of Edward Kelley, a soldier in the War of the Rebellion. She is totally blind, and very deaf and is without money except her State aid of eight dollars per month. She has one daughter who works in the mill when able and the wages so earned together with the State aid is the only source of support of the two. Mrs. Kelley has suffered from chronic bronchitis and arteriosclerosis for at least six years prior hereto.
