STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Susan J. Tarr of Vinalhaven, Maine.

Resolved: That a pension of ten dollars per month be
2 allowed Susan J. Tarr of Vinalhaven, Maine, widow of
3 Franklin B. Tarr, a soldier in the Civil War, beginning with
4 the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirteen, and
5 continuing during the pleasure of the Legislature and until
6 otherwise ordered.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Susan J. Tarr of Vinalhaven, Maine, the wife of the said Franklin B. Tarr, receives no United States pension and has no property whatever, no means of support. Her age is 76 years. She is a woman in every way worthy and we hope this aid be granted.
