STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of James Lombard.

Resolved: That there be paid to James Lombard of Gor-
2 ham eight dollars per month from the Military fund for
3 soldiers payable quarterly beginning January 1, 1913, and
4 continuing during the pleasure of the Legislature and until
5 otherwise ordered.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

James Lombard of Gorham enlisted in the Civil war when he was sixteen years of age in the 20th Maine Regiment. He served two months and the war closed. He was stricken with a paralytic shock last year and his condition is such that he cannot ever do any more work. He owns a house in Gorham Village in which he and his wife reside. He has no other property. He has one child, a son, who has a wife and children and does muscular labor for their support.
