RESOLVE in favor of Callie Mains.

---

*Resolved,* That there be paid to Callie Mains of Buxton  
2 six dollars per month payable quarterly from the military  
3 fund for soldiers, beginnig March 1, 1913, and continuing  
4 during the pleasure of the legislature and until otherwise  
5 ordered.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Callie Mains of Buxton, the widow of Ivory Mains, is nearly sixty-six years of age. She married Mr. Mains in 1867. Mr. Mains enlisted and served in Company L, 1st Regiment Dist. Col. Cavalry, and in Company E, 1st Reg. Maine Cavalry. He served in all one and one-half years. He died in 1911, was unable to do any work the last eleven years of his life. Mrs. Mains receives twelve dollars per month U. S. pension. She has a small place worth three hundred dollars (\$300.00) which she receives no income from. She lives with her only child, an unmarried daughter who does house work at three (\$3.00) per week. Mrs. Mains has rheumatism and is not able to do very much work.
