STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Helen B. Hobart for State Pension.

Resolved: That there be paid out of the treasury of the
2 State to Helen B. Hobart of Farmington, a pension of eight
3 dollars per month, beginning on the first day of January,
4 one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and to continue
5 during the pleasure of the Legislature.
