STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of aid in repairing highway in Town of
Readfield.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) for the purpose of
3 repairing the "Pond" road, so called, connecting the Kent's
4 Hill road with the Mt. Vernon road in the town of Read-
5 field; provided that the town of Readfield appropriates the
6 sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) for the same purpose;
7 both sums to be expended under the direction of the State
8 Highway Department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road has been closed to automobiles by legislative act, for nearly eight years owing to the fact that it is narrow, has many curves, and in places is marshy and in other places is unsafe by reason of passing over ledges. It is of little use to the town of Readfield but is the natural Maine highway from Farmington and Franklin county through Vienna, Mt. Vernon, and Readfield to Augusta. It is also a mail route from Readfield Depot to Vienna. Public convenience and safety require its repair.
