STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to incorporate the Kennebec Gas and Fuel Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Carroll W. Abbott, L. E. Thayer, Mark J.
2 Bartlett of Waterville in the county of Kennebec and State
3 of Maine; Silas T. Lawry of Fairfield in the county of
4 Somerset and State of Maine; John H. Lancaster of Skow-
5 hegan in the said county of Somerset and Wm. Kuem-
6 merle, Jr., of Philadelphia, in the state of Pennsylvania,
7 their associates, successors and assigns are hereby made a
8 body corporate by the name of the Kennebec Gas and Fuel
9 Company.

Sect. 2. The purposes of said corporation are the manufacturing, selling, distributing and supplying of gas for heating, lighting, fuel manufacturing and mechanical purposes in the city of Waterville and the towns of Oakland, Vassalboro, Winslow, Benton, Fairfield and Skowhegan, with all the rights, powers and privileges, and subject to all the restrictions and liabilities, by law, incident to corporations of similar nature; also to sell and dispose of the by-products incident to the manufacture of gas.

Sect. 3. The capital stock of said corporation shall be five hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each. Said corporation may hold real and personal estate necessary and convenient for its purposes aforesaid.

Sect. 4. Said company shall have the right to manufacture, sell and dispose of gas in the city of Waterville and the towns of Oakland, Vassalboro, Winslow, Benton, Fairfield and Skowhegan and to lay gas pipes in any of the public streets and highways in said municipalities and to take up, replace, and repair the same, and to build, construct and maintain, fixtures, reservoir, gas holders, and other things requisite, proper and convenient for the manufacture, distribution and sale of gas in said municipalities, subject to the permission of the municipal officers of said municipalities and such reasonable restrictions as they may lawfully impose, and to the general laws of the state relative thereto.

Sect. 5. Said Kennebec Gas and Fuel Company may issue
2 its bonds upon such rates and time as it may deem expedi-
3 ent and in such amount, not exceeding five hundred thou-
4 sand dollars, as may be required for the objects of its in-
5 corporation and for the purposes authorized by this act,
6 and secure the same by mortgage upon franchise and prop-
7 erty of said company.
