STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the State Pension Clerk.

Resolved, That the state pension clerk is hereby authorized 2 to expend such sum, under the direction of the governor 3 and council, not exceeding four hundred dollars yearly, as 4 may be necessary to properly examine the claims presented 5 to his office, the same to be paid out of the appropriation 6 for state pensions for the years nineteen hundred and thir-7 teen and fourteen.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Many of the claims presented to the State Pension Office are made in such a way, many cases being made by men who are unused to preparing blanks of a public nature, and the further fact that many of the most needy and deserving cases are those who by reason of false pride will not fully state their needs to the town officials, make it absolutely necessary that the State Pension Clerk should visit the several cities, towns and plantations in which said applicants reside, in order that justice may be done to both the pensioner and the state.
