# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges granted by
chapter four hundred and seventy-two of the Private and
3 Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled
4 "An Act to incorporate the Livermore Falls Light and Power
5 Company," as amended by chapter one hundred and one of
6 the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and nine7 ty-nine, and as further amended by chapter two hundred
8 and nine of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hun9 dred and one, are further amended as follows:

#### HOUSE-No. 356.

Section 1. The same rights, powers and privileges granted 11 by chapter four hundred and seventy-two of the Private 12 and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, 13 entitled "An Act to incorporate the Livermore Falls Light 14 and Power Company," as amended by chapter one hundred 15 and one of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hun-16 dred and ninety-nine, and as further amended by chapter 17 two hundred and nine of the Private and Special Laws of 18 nineteen hundred and one, are hereby granted to the said 19 Livermore Falls Light and Power Company to extend to 20 the towns of Canton and Dixfield in the county of Oxford, 21 exclusive of the village of Dixfield.

'Sect 2. The towns of Canton and Dixfield in the county 23 of Oxford are hereby authorized to contract with said cor-24 poration for lighting the streets within said towns, exclu-25 sive of Dixfield village, upon such terms as they may mutu-26 ally agree.

'Sect. 3. The provision of this act shall not prevent or 28 prohibit the Rumford Falls Light and Water Company from 29 extending its system and furnishing light and power in the 30 town of Canton, by way of the river road on both sides of 31 the Androscoggin river and territory adjacent to the same 32 from Peru and Mexico to said town of Canton, but not in 33 the territory known as East Dixfield, Dixfield Center or 34 Savery Hill, so called.'
