STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to extend and enlarge the charter of the Ocean and
Northern Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Ocean
2 and Northern Railroad Company which were granted by
3 chapter three hundred forty-two of the Private and Special
4 Laws of the state of Maine for the year nineteen hundred
5 seven, and extended by chapter forty-six of the Private and
6 Special Laws of the state of Maine for the year nineteen
7 hundred nine, and also extended by chapter two hundred-
8 thirty-seven of the Private and Special Laws of the state

9 of Maine for the year nineteen hundred eleven, are hereby
10 extended for two years additional, and the persons named
11 in said act, their associates and successors, shall have the
12 rights, powers and privileges that were granted to them by
13 said act to be exercised by them for the same purposes as
14 specified in said act.

Sect. 2. In addition to the rights, powers and privileges
2 hereinabove extended said company shall have the right to
3 locate, construct, equip, maintain, operate or lease a con-
4 tinuation of its line of railroad from any point in said plan-
5 tation number thirty-three in said Hancock county to any
6 point in the city of Brewer in Penobscot county, or to any
7 point in any town in said Penobscot county between the city
8 of Brewer and town of Milford situated on the east side of
9 the Penobscot river.
